Back in 2019, as a summer intern, I learned what it is like to work in a behavioral health environment. During this time, I observed and interacted with youth in a carefully controlled environment to promote safety and collaborate with counselors and parents to report youth behavior and progress. At present, as a counselor, I work with individuals, groups, and communities to improve mental health by encouraging clients to discuss emotions and experiences and examine issues including anger management, relationships, and self-image while developing therapeutic processes. These tasks reinforce and enhance my knowledge in mental health care and promote growth and proficiency as a future clinician.

While working as a counselor, I am also doing field placement or master’s level internship in CASTLE Berlin. As a master’s level intern, I perform duties such as managing caseloads and developing treatment plans alongside my field supervisor. Other responsibilities include evaluation of client needs, treatment options, and solutions to current challenges.

With these responsibilities come a greater understanding of why the social work field is a calling and not just another job. The value of working with clients and their families in a one-on-one setting gives me a sense of fulfillment, hoping they receive the help they need over their situation.
